Striking the Biblical Balances in Parenting

Things to Learn:

- Not giving way to “Control-Freak-Parenting”
- How to bring both the law and grace to bear
- Keeping the right balance between dealing with the heart vs. behavior

Takeaways:

- When we give into constant worry and anger in our parenting, we convey the message to our children that God is not sovereign in their lives or ours.
- While teaching your children to obey, keep your heart focused on ensuring that you are shepherding your children’s hearts, not only their outward obedience.
- It’s the grace of God that brings about the tremendous gift of faith from generation to generation.

Courageous Fatherhood

Things to Learn:

- Understanding the many definitions of “father”
- Principles for how dads can be involved in the family
- How God responds to brokenness

Takeaways:

- If you want to improve culture, pour into dads and help them step into their God-given role.
- God has eternally been Father, and He created that role on earth as an introduction to Who He is as our Heavenly Father.
- Children are wired to get nurturing from their mothers, but look to their fathers when answering the “who am I” questions.
- Most kids today haven’t heard their father say “I love you” to them. Let’s not be part of that statistic.
- The world gives love and affirmation after it’s earned. The Gospel flips that on its head with God giving His children love and affirmation despite their inability to earn it.

Things to Learn:

- The purpose of discipline

Things to Learn:

- Understanding your strong-willed child
- How to recognize and encourage your child's potential
- Principles for training a strong will

Takeaways:

- The goal is not to break a child's strong will, but to teach them to handle it maturely.
- Strong-willed children are looking for control, power, and victory, and when we react emotionally, they see that as a win for them.
- A strong will is an asset when it is trained for righteousness.
- Regularly communicate your unconditional love, even when your kids are being difficult.
- Communicate clearly to your child what you are saying so that they are not ramped up emotionally by misunderstanding.
